St Josephine Bakhita is a brand new Catholic primary school in the new Five Farms estate in Clyde North and is situated 46 kilometres southeast of Melbourne's Central Business District on the lands of the Bunurong People. The school will be the thirty-ninth Catholic primary school in the Diocese of Sale and the second primary school in the Parish of St Thomas the Apostle.

The school opened in January 2025 with an initial enrolment of 120 students. In 2026, the school will grow by 4 classes. The long-term enrolment projection for St Josephine's is 700 students (100 students each year until we reach capacity).

The school is named after St Josephine Bakhita, the first contemporary female African Saint. St Josephine Bakhita is the patron saint of victims of modern slavery and human trafficking. The school serves as a beacon for sustainability by striving to set an example of responsible sourcing practices.
